Don has been the President of the British Columbia Institute of Technology since March 2008. BCIT is one of B.C.'s largest post secondary educational institutions, with enrolments of 16,000 full time students and 32,000 part time students.

Don's career has spanned the academic, government and private sectors. He has taught economics at Harvard University and the University of Saskatchewan. His government service has included positions as deputy minister in the ministries of finance, forests, trade and investment, and education in the Saskatchewan and British Columbia governments. From 1997 to 2001, Don was vice-president with Weldwood of Canada, a forest products company with annual sales in excess of \$1 billion. Immediately prior to joining BCIT Don was the principal of Analytica Consulting, which provided advice to public and private sector clients.

Don has been a director on a number of profit and not-for-profit boards.

Dr. Wright holds a Bachelor of Commerce from the University of Saskatchewan, a Masters in Economics from the University of British Columbia, and a PhD in Economics from Harvard University.
